HISTORY OF COLLEGE OF NURSING, SYNOD HOSPITAL (CONSH)

The Synod Hospital was established in 1928 by the Welsh Mission as the Welsh Mission Hospital. It later transitioned to the Presbyterian Church Synod Hospital. Over the decades, its name evolved from the Presbyterian Church Synod Hospital and the Presbyterian Hospital to its current identity as Synod Hospital. The hospital is situated in DERHKEN TLANG, a beautiful hillock located in Durtlang area. This area was gifted to the Welsh Missionaries by Pu M. Suaka Chawngthu, who was then the Chief of the Durtlang village. He had established this village as a place of refuge for the early Christians who suffered persecution at various places in Mizoram. The Reverend Mendus and Reverend Sandy accompanied by his wife, along with the Village Chief, and certain Church Elders formally dedicated the land for the Mission Headquarters.

One of the first Welsh Missionaries to live and work in Mizoram was Rev. D. E. Jones, who, though not a medical man himself, nevertheless had to attend to the sick and the needy, besides preaching the Gospel. He deeply felt the need for a doctor. When he returned from a furlough in 1908, he brought with him Dr. Peter Fraser and his wife all the way from Wales, to start the healing Ministry in Mizoram. Dr. Fraser opened a clinic and a dispensary in Mission Veng, Aizawl and continued in this ministry till 1912. In the year 1924, Mr. D. Thianga, a Compounder, opened a new dispensary at Durtlang at the request of Rev. Sandy and Rev. Chhuahkhama. A year later, in 1925, Rev. Sandy who had started a Theological School in Aizawl, shifted the school near the dispensary in Durtlang. Unfortunately, he died one year later, on the 6th November,

1926, whereupon the Theological School was shifted back to Aizawl while the dispensary remained at Durtlang.

On the 22nd of February, 1928, Dr. John Williams, LMP, arrived at Durtlang. He was one of the pioneer Missionary doctors and was affectionately called Pu Dâka by the people. Dr. John Williams along with Mr. D. Thianga (Pharmacist) and Mrs. Tlâwmkungi (Staff Nurse) converted the old Theological School building to a hospital. The first patient was admitted on the 6th March, 1928 and the hospital at Durtlang formally came into existence and was named the Welsh Mission Hospital. The training programme for nurses was initiated at the time of the establishment of the hospital, and the first nursing student, a 16 year old girl named Khuangi, was admitted that same year.

The first missionary nurse to work at Durtlang was Miss Winifred Margaret, who arrived on the 7th of January, 1929. She served for 7 years and during that period she undertook much pioneering work in establishing the Nursing School and evolving the nursing services in the hospital. The next missionary nurse was Miss Eirlys Williams (Pi Sangi) who arrived in 1932. She devoted nearly 7 years teaching in the school and working in the wards. Miss Gladys M. Evans (Pi Hruaii) arrived on the 11th of March, 1936 and her main concern was in Community and Public Health. She spent much of her time visiting the interior villages. Soon after the arrival of Miss Evans, a new hospital building constructed by Rev. Lewis Evans was occupied and the bed strength increased from 14 to 40 in the new building. Dr. (Miss) Gwyneth Parul Roberts B.Sc, MBBS (affectionately known as Pi Puii) arrived in December, 1938, and among other things, one of her first concerns was the enhancement of Nursing Education, and accordingly she

took step towards achieving these goals. Under her guidance, the nurse training programme started by the early missionaries was further upgraded and was recognized by the Indian Nursing Council in 1944. It thus became *one of the first nursing schools in North-East, and first of its kind in Mizoram; it remained the only nursing school in Mizoram for many years.* In the years that followed, two missionary nurses, Miss Anne Dorothy Harries and Sister Imogene P. Roberts came to work in the hospital and contributed significantly to the improvement of the school. The last missionary nurse was Miss May Bounds, who arrived in 1954 and left in 1968. She was a deeply dedicated Christian whose life was marked by love and compassion. She did much to improve the quality and raised the standard of nursing in the wards. Under her guidance, the School improved steadily and made significant progress, with many students achieving excellent results in their examinations. She spent fifteen years at Durtlang and was the last Missionary to leave.

The Mizoram Presbyterian Church, Synod Annual Conference (Synod Inkhawmpui), held in December 2002, December 2007, December 2014 and December 2017, resolved to upgrade the School of Nursing (GNM Diploma) to Degree Course (Basic B.Sc. Nursing) Collegiate programme. In pursuance of the final resolution, the School of Nursing, Synod Hospital, Durtlang, Aizawl, Mizoram (established in the 28th February, 1928) was upgraded to a Collegiate Programme on the 20th of June, 2019 with permission granted by the Government of Mizoram, Indian Nursing Council (INC), Mizoram Nursing Council (MNC) and Mizoram University. The College is affiliated with Mizoram University (Central University), Aizawl, Mizoram.

PHILOSOPHY OF THE HOSPITAL & COLLEGE

The College of Nursing, Synod Hospital is an educational institution run by Mizoram Presbyterian Church, whose primary aim is to educate and train young men and women to become good Christian nurses and to equip them in the spirit of Jesus Christ for service in the relief of suffering, prevention of diseases and promotion of health. This implies not merely training in professional skills, but also in building good character and having right Christian attitudes. The students and staff are expected to maintain the highest degree of moral standards in their profession and private lives. Since its inception, as a Hospital and as a School, the missionaries who served here had maintained a spirit of cooperation and mutual understanding between all the Doctors and Nurses in particular, where each one acknowledged the contribution made by the other towards attaining their goal which is to bring about alleviation of pain and suffering in a true Christian spirit, and this spirit which is a distinct feature of this institution is being maintained till today.

The Governing Body of the College believes that the professional nurse is in a position to render unique contributions towards care and rehabilitation of the individual, the family and the community, both in health and diseases. It also believes that nursing education is a process of growth directed towards the development of the student as a person and as a prospective member of the nursing profession, who will uphold the dignity of the nursing profession and strive to establish professional autonomy in nursing education and practice. Nursing education is a combination of theory and practice applied in a realistic environment with faculty guidance. It prepares nurses to be capable of delivering quality

nursing care with a holistic approach regardless of social status, caste, race, language or religion. To care for the sick and the suffering with love and compassion, as commanded by our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and to manifest the love of God for mankind through the care of the whole person in his/her physical, mental and spiritual need is in essence the basis on which the Nursing Service and Education of this institution rests.

A. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Location : The College of Nursing, Synod Hospital (CONSH) is situated on a hilltop in Durtlang, on the outskirts of Aizawl City, the Capital of Mizoram, and alongside the Aizawl - Silchar highway.

The institution has produced more than 2000 GNM & ANM nursing graduates. So far, 90 students from the B.Sc Nursing programme have successfully graduated from the institution. At present, the College admits only B.Sc. (Nursing) students, in accordance with the regulations prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council, the Mizoram Nursing Council, and Mizoram University. The annual student intake is 30 (thirty) and the minimum prerequisite educational qualification is Pre-University or its equivalent i.e., Class XII (Science) with Physics, Chemistry, and Biology, securing a minimum of 45% aggregate marks from a recognized Board.

Soon after admission the students are introduced to the theory and art of Nursing. The work of a nurse is demanding and carries heavy responsibilities for the welfare of the patients entrusted to his/her care.

2. Description of Programme : The programme is a four year (eight-semester) Basic Bachelor of Science in Nursing [B.Sc. (Nursing)] course, the course is recognized by the Indian Nursing Council, Mizoram Nursing Council and Mizoram University. The academic session usually starts in August each year, with an annual intake of 30 students.

3. A selected candidate, once admitted, is not permitted to leave/withdraw from the Institution during the course. Any defaulter shall be liable to pay the full course fees along with the penalty specified under the Disciplinary Action rules.

4.RAGGING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

In accordance with the recommendations of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Institution has constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee, an Anti-Ragging Squad, Monitoring Cell, and Mentoring Cell to ensure a safe and disciplined academic environment. ***The College Help line No 9402329159.***

Ragging is a serious violation of human rights. All students are expected to uphold humanitarian values and say "No" to ragging. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the Hostel and the College/Institution, in hospitals, during community programmes, in all modes of transportation, and at any academic or extracurricular activity, whether conducted in private or public settings. Any incident of ragging reported to or detected by the Institution or the College Managing Committee will be dealt with strictly. The student(s) concerned shall be given an opportunity to be heard; however, if the explanation is found unsatisfacto-

ry, the Management may impose suspension, cancellation of admission, or initiate legal proceedings in accordance with the applicable laws. The College of Nursing has always taken adequate measures for the prevention and control of ragging. However, due unfortunate incidents of ragging reported in other colleges across the country and the coverage of such incidents in newspapers and visual media, there is anxiety and fear among freshers and their family members. To address such concerns and to provide a safe and favorable environment for learning, the College has assigned mentors among the faculty and senior students to offer counselling and guidance on the prevention of ragging.

In compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the College of Nursing, Synod Hospital, Durtlang, Aizawl, Mizoram is committed to maintaining a ragging-free institution. 2. Monthly Fee :-

D. SUBJECT AND EXAMINATION

The theoretical and practical training provided in the College and the Hospital is conducted in accordance with the regulations and curriculum of the Indian Nursing Council and Mizoram University. Examinations are held at the end of each Semester with two internal sessional examination per semester. Supplementary examinations are conducted in accordance with the provisions laid down by the Mizoram University Examination Department.

E. COURSE DETAILS

The name of the course is Bachelor of Science in Nursing [B.Sc. (Nursing)] which is designed for the provision of comprehensive theoretical knowledge and practical skills in the field of nursing. The course spans four years/eight semesters, with each semester consisting of 26 weeks of theory and practical training.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing [B.Sc. (Nursing)] course at the College of Nursing, Synod Hospital, Durtlang, Aizawl, Mizoram has been recognized by the Indian Nursing Council, Mizoram Nursing Council and Mizoram University since 2019.

H. VACATION :

I. COURSE COMPLETION:

Upon successful completion of four years (4 years) of study, students may leave the institution only after declaration of the final examination results by the Mizoram University.

J. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The completed application form must reach the Principal's Office, College of Nursing, Synod Hospital, Durtlang, Mizoram within the notified timeframe. Applications received after the deadline will be rejected.

- a) Application forms and Prospectus may be obtained

from the Principal's Office, College of Nursing, Synod Hospital, Durtlang; Dr. Frasers Clinic, Mission Veng, Aizawl; or downloaded from the College website www.consh.edu.in upon payment of Rs 500/-.

b) All the information provided in the application form must be accurate. Furnishing false or misleading information will result in disqualification. If any false is discovered at any point during the course, it may lead to the students expulsion.

c) Photocopies of all necessary Certificates duly attested by the applicant or a Gazetted Officer should be enclosed. Once submitted, the copies of the certificate will not be returned.

d) Certificates in languages other than English/Mizo are to be translated into English and duly attested by the Head/Principal of the school/college last attended.

e) Foreign Degree holders must have an Equivalence Degree Certificate approved by the Government of India.

f) Foreigners must hold a student/provisional student visa to study at the College of Nursing, Synod Hospital, Durtlang, Aizawl, Mizoram. Admission will not be granted on the basis of any other type of visa. Non-Indian national may appear for the entrance test and interview. If they qualify, admission is granted only upon submission of a **“NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE”** issued by the Government of India. This certificate may be obtained by applying through the Chairman/Director, Mizoram Board of School Education/ School Education Department, Government of Mizoram,

India, to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, Nirman Bhawan, Rajpath Area, Central Secretariat, New Delhi - 110 001. Obtaining a “**No Objection Certificate**” is the responsibility of the candidate. If a selected candidate fails to obtain the certificate, the provisional offer of admission shall lapse.

h) Candidate should enclose his/her attested photo copies of :-

- H.S.L.C. Mark sheet and Certificate.
- HSSLC Science (Physics, Chemistry, Biology) Mark sheet and Certificate. (Provisional Certificate is accepted)
- Recent Church Membership Certificate. (For Christians)
- Birth Certificate/Baptismal Certificate

i) Following a preliminary selection based on the marks obtained in the qualifying examination, a limited number of applicants will be called for an interview. Being called for the interview does not imply selection.

K. ELIGIBILITY

1. Candidate from science stream, who has passed the qualifying 12th Standard examination with a minimum aggregate of 45% in Physics, Chemistry & Biology are eligible. Passing English individually is also mandatory.

2. Both male and female candidates are eligible.

3. The minimum age shall be 17 years as on 31st December.

4. Candidates from State Open School recognized by the State Government (IGNOU) and National Institute of

Open School (NIOS) recognized by the Central Government are also eligible.

5. Reservation:

a) **Disability** : 5% Disability reservation to be considered for disabled candidates with a disability of loco-motor to the tune of 40% to 50% of the lower extremity and other eligibility criteria with regard to qualification will be same as prescribed for General category candidates. The upper age limit shall be relaxed by 5 years for disabled candidates. (Applicants must provide a valid Disability Certificate).

b) **EDG (Economically Disadvantaged Group):**
The College of Nursing, Synod Hospital provides provisions for students who are expected to become rising intellectuals but come from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. The specifications for the allocation of EDG (Economically Disadvantaged Group) seats in the College are as follows:

i) In every semester, 50% of the course fee will be waived, while the monthly fee and other charges **must** be paid by the student.

ii) The provision shall be granted to **no** more than three (3) students per batch.

iii) This decision regarding eligibility for the EDG shall be finalized while the applicant is in the 2nd semester.

iv) Following a review of the applicant's economic background, the final selection of eligible students for EDG seats shall be made and reported to the Synod Hospital Board

Executive Committee (SHBEC) by the College Managing Committee.

v) Applicants for EDG seats are required to submit a verification letter of their economic background, issued by their respective Church Committee. The **verification letter must** state the applicant's background details, Church Committee resolution number, date and year of issuance.

vi) EDG candidates found guilty of falsifying their financial status at any time during the course of study shall be liable to reimburse all previously exempted fees.

vii) The specifications for the allocation of EDG seats are subjected to change at any time by the Synod Hospital Board Executive Committee (SHBEC).

6. Candidates should be medically fit. (A thorough medical check-up will be conducted after the final selection results are declared and prior to admission into the course).

7. Candidate should be a full member of **his/her** respective church. (If a Christian)

L. ENTRANCE EXAMINATION AND SELECTION

Selection of Candidates shall be based on the Entrance Test and Interview. The final Selection will be made by the Competent Authority of the Institution.

The Penalty is decided by the Hospital Board Committee and College Managing Committee. The prescribed penalty may be revised from time to time, as and when the need arises.

The penalty may be waived in cases of ill health or other circumstances deemed reasonable by the Hospital Board Committee and the College Managing Committee through a formal resolution.

N. WITHDRAWAL AND DISMISSAL

If any student decides to withdraw voluntarily from the College at any time before the completion of the course he/she is required to pay Rs 1,00,000/- (One lakh) on the day he/she leaves the institution. Any fees once paid are non-refundable.

If any student leaves the Institution within Ten (10) days of admission, no fine shall be imposed. However, all fees once paid are non-refundable.

The Hospital Board and College Managing Committee reserve the rights to dismiss anyone whose conduct is found unsatisfactory any time during the academic tenure.
